## Lough Derg RNLI aids eight over May holiday

Lough Derg RNLI came requested the skipper to to the assistance of a total of eight people in two separate callouts on the lake over the May Bank Holiday weekend.

The callouts were made on Friday afternoon and this Sunday.In the first incident, Valentia Coast Guard requested Lough Derg RNLI to launch following a report from a member of the public that a vessel was aground at Castlelough below Parker's Point.

At 1.55pm Lough Derg lifeboat Jean Spier launched with helm Eleanor Hooker, Smyth, Chris Parker and Richard Nolan on board and reached the casualty vessel close to Castlelough. They navigated the lifeboat through safe water close to the casualty vessel.

The lake boat was grounded and pivoting on a rock mid-keel.

engine's The propellers were not damaged. The RNLI volunteer climbed aboard the vessel, which then made its way alongside the lifeboat. On Sunday evening,

At 6.13pm Lough Derg lifeboat Jean RNLI Spier launched helm Owen Cavanagh, Eleanor Hooker and Joe O'Donoghue on board

The lifeboat crew navigated through safe water to the casualty vessel. There were six people on board, all safe and unharmed. They were requested to put on their lifejackets

A RNLI lifeboat crew transferred member across to the casualty vessel and checked under floorboards to confirm that the vessel was not holed.

established Having that it was not possible to take the vessel off the shoal from the bow of the casualty vessel, it was decided that four of the passengers would use their tender to take them to Rossmore Quay close by, their intended destination. A passing fishing vessel took the remaining passengers.
